

CENTRAL TOOL ROOM & TRAINING CENTRE **BHUBANESWAR**

BRIEF HISTORY

In 1970s, with an overall objective to promote development of Small Scale Industries in India, few Tool Rooms were established in collaboration with Govt. of Denmark, Germany and UNIDO, etc. While reviewing the performance of those Tool Rooms it was felt to establish more Tool Rooms. Under International Technical cooperation programme an agreement was signed on 21.04.1989 between Govt. of India and Govt. of Denmark to establish 03 (three) new Tool Rooms in Bhubaneswar, Jamshedpur and Mysore. The project agreement was signed on 21.06.1989 to establish a Tool Room at Bhubaneswar in collaboration between Govt. of India, Govt. of Denmark and Govt. of Odisha. As per the agreement the State Govt. of Odisha was to provide land, building and infrastructural facilities,. Govt. of Denmark share was to provide 60% of the machines and equipments required for the Tool Room and other requirements like 40% of machines and equipments and all recurring expenses to be borne by Govt. of India. The Tool Room at Bhubaneswar was named as “Central Tool Room and Training Centre” (CTTC), Bhubaneswar and registered as a Society on 07.05.1990 under Society Registration Act, XXI, 1860. The main objectives of CTTC, Bhubaneswar was to provide training in Tool Engineering and allied fields, create a common facility Centre for the Small Scale Industries to develop/ manufacture Press Tool, Jigs, Fixtures, Dies, Moulds etc. and provide Consultancy to SSIs. The Tool Room started its operation imparting training programme in Tool and Die Making in September 1991 at Mancheswar Industrial Estate, Bhubaneswar. Production Department started in September 1994 in the permanent campus at B-36, Chandaka Industrial Area, Bhubaneswar-751024 along with the Training Department and as such the Tool Room became full fledged.

Management of affairs of CTTC, Bhubaneswar rests with a Governing Council constituted with representatives of Govt. of India, Govt. of Odisha, Industries Associations and representatives of Small/ Medium/ Large Scale Tool Users/ Manufacturers. The Governing Council is constituted/reconstituted by the Govt. of India for a period of three years. The present Governing Council was reconstituted with effect from 13.12.2010.
